Green Schools Network (GSN) is a collection of primary schools with improved vegetative cover that, together, create a greener and healthier Malawi. This multi-dimensional program addresses WASH and nutrition challenges by constructing infrastructure, including rainwater tanks, and promoting sustainable agriculture techniques.

It educates the students and communities on safe sanitation, hygiene, menstrual hygiene management, and permaculture to improve community health.
