


Annual Report 2020-21 Going for the Goals: In Praise of Persistence

"Ensure healthy lives and well being for all at all ages."

In 2020 and early 2021, CPAR readied an ambitious plan to increase the training and scope of practice for rural midwives and health workers, leverage the skills and talents of in-demand doctors in far away hospitals, and introduce rural women to the benefits of prenatal care and delivery in clinical settings with skilled healthcare staff

Lack of access to prenatal care results in preventable birth injuries, greater risk to mother and child, low birth-weight babies and improper care and nutrition for mothers-to-be.

Prenatal care includes ensuring mothers get the nutrition they need for healthy babies

While the pandemic delayed our start date, we used the opportunity to refine our training and create smaller class sizes and more training opportunities when in-person training opened up in early 2021.

"To ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all."

Elementary schools in rural Malawi often host more than 1,000 students . . . and have little to no access to water.

Our Green Schools Network project expanded to five more schools in 2019 - bringing rainwater harvesting tanks to promote sanitation and hygiene and capitalize on Malawi's rainy season.

Additionally, our Green Schools program included education in sustainable agriculture and the schools' 30,000-litre tanks ensure a bountiful crop of nutritious vegetables in the school garden, and fruit and shade trees to enhance the soil, mitigate deforestation and calm the dust storms around the schools.

The pandemic delayed the start on our next, most ambitious phase - adding 7 new schools to the Network - but allowed much of the groundwork to begin, to continue to expand the Network

Peer Training Session on Sexual and Reproductive Health, Ethiopia

"To reduce inequality within and among countries."

In 2020 we announced our partnership with the **Government of Canada** to deliver sexual and reproductive health training and information to rural areas of Ethiopia.

Working with teachers, students, and women's groups we began the process of training and empowering others to encourage women and young girls to get the care and information they need to reach their full potential.

While COVID-19 delayed the start of our in-school activities, we were able to pivot to public information sessions through radio and other means - using our radio time first to spread information about COVID-19 protective measures, and eventually pivoting to our planned messaging around health care, family planning and gender-based violence.




The percentage of health facilities in Assela, Fiche and Gondar with adolescent-friendly sexual and reproductive health services
